#### **Immigrants in Healthcare**

#### The Backbone of U.S. Healthcare

Immigrants play a critical role in the U.S. healthcare system, from doctors to support staff, ensuring care for millions of Americans.

- ☑ More than 25% of U.S. doctors are immigrants, providing essential care across the country.
- ✓ Immigrants make up 22% of nursing assistants and 19% of home health aides, supporting aging populations and vulnerable patients.
- ☑ During the COVID-19 pandemic, immigrant healthcare workers were vital to the response, making up a significant percentage of frontline workers.

## **Shaping the Future Through Education**

Immigrants are not only educators but also researchers and support staff who help shape the next generation.

- ✓ Immigrant teachers and professors make up 13% of the education workforce, enriching classrooms with diverse perspectives and experiences.
- ✓ Immigrants in higher education often serve in critical research roles, with 28% of researchers in STEM fields being foreign-born.
- ☐ Immigrants are instrumental in addressing teacher shortages, especially in underserved regions and subjects like math, science, and special education.

Immigrants are essential to the agricultural sector, ensuring the nation's food supply remains stable and affordable.

- **73% of U.S. farmworkers** are immigrants, ensuring crops are planted, harvested, and delivered to markets.
- ☑ Immigrant workers are responsible for **over \$50 billion** in annual agricultural output, critical to feeding the U.S. population.
- ☑ Immigrant labor significantly reduces food costs for American consumers, making essential produce more affordable.

# **Fuel Innovation and Growth in STEM Fields**

Immigrants are driving innovation in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics, which is crucial for the U.S.'s global competitiveness.

- ☑ Immigrants make up 17% of the U.S. STEM workforce, contributing to advancements in technology, research, and medicine.
- ☑ 28% of researchers in the U.S. are immigrants, making critical contributions in fields like biotechnology, engineering, and computer science.
- ✓ Immigrants have founded 50% of America's billion-dollar startups, driving innovation and creating jobs in tech.

#### **Immigrants in Critical Infrastructure**

## **Keeping the Nation's Infrastructure Running**

Immigrants work in construction, transportation, and utilities, sectors critical to maintaining the country's infrastructure.

- ☑ Immigrants represent 24% of the U.S. construction workforce, building homes, roads, and essential infrastructure.
- ☑ 38% of workers in the U.S. landscaping industry are immigrants, ensuring the upkeep of public spaces and urban environments.
- ✓ Immigrants are key to keeping the U.S. transportation sector running, making up 26% of workers in industries like trucking and public transit.
